Have fun developing trivia about

Ages: All Ages

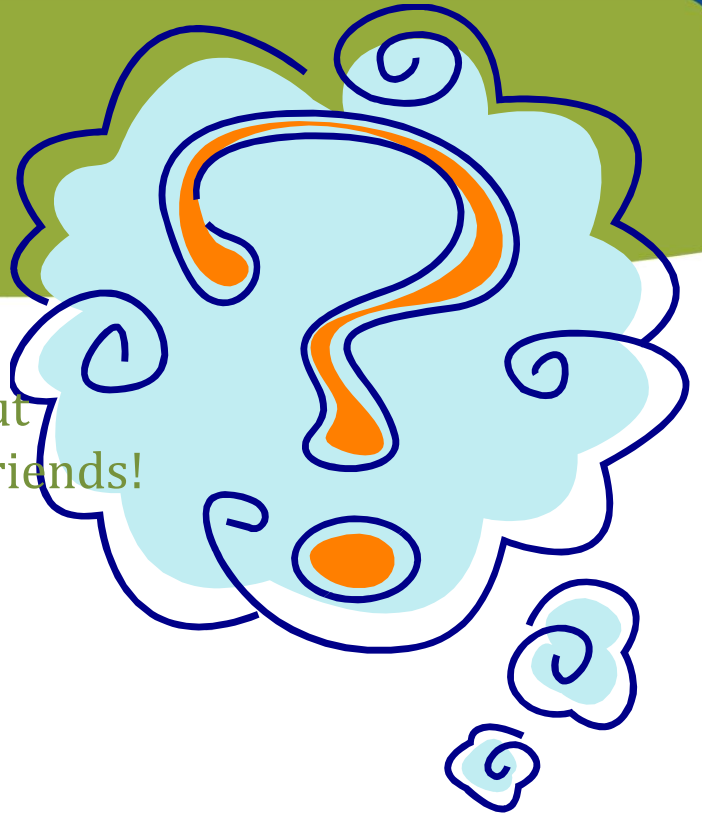
Time: 30 - 45 minutes

Materials Needed:

Computer, Internet, printer

Instructions:

1. Individually, youth spend 10 – 15 minutes using the internet and interviewing Club staff members to develop fun trivia facts about their Club and local area. Each youth should work hard to find two fun facts that are different than everyone else's.
2. Youth then spend approximately five minutes developing not-exactly-true-trivia, perhaps items that sound like they should be related to the Club and local area but are not.
3. As each member finishes, a staff member (or Club member) will type up the four items in multiple choice format. Once all are completed, trivia

questionnaires should be printed and provided to Club members for them to decide which two facts are true and which two are not from each section.

4. The member who correctly identifies the most true facts wins, as does the one who throws the most people off.

Extension Ideas:

This activity can be extended over a longer period of time by having small groups of Club members responsible for creating weekly Club trivia questions in this same format. Question can be posted on a bulletin board or on the Club's website on a regular schedule.

If digital cameras are available, this activity can be turned into a field trip. Have small groups of Club member's take photos in and around the Club and then develop trivia questions based upon the photos taken.
